ITE Great Lakes District Meeting Summary August 29-30, 2021 in Columbus, Ohio By: Ellen Nightingale, MDOT

The Great Lakes District Meeting was held August 29th through August 31st, 2021 at the Hilton Easton in Columbus, Ohio. Approximately 175 attendees traveled from across the newly redistricted ITE Great Lakes District, including Ohio, Indiana, Michigan, Wisconsin, Illinois, Minnesota, North Dakota, South Dakota.

The district meeting had many challenges to overcome with the COVID-19 pandemic. The original date for the conference was scheduled for April 19-20th, 2021. With the number of travel restrictions from various companies, the decision was made in January to move the conference. The student traffic bowl was still held on April 20th virtually.

The first day of the meeting began with an optional Transportation Impact Analysis (TIA) workshop led by Eric Tripi (GHD) and Brad Strader (MSKS). All eight modules were taught in a one-day crash course. This workshop was a Great Lakes-focused version of the consistently sold out International ITE TIA workshop developed by the same instructors.

On Sunday afternoon, the new GL-ITEy race began. Previously in the Midwestern District, the M-ITEy race was a scavenger hunt in teams to grow familiar with the local area, network with your team, and to raise money for the endowment fund. Now with the new redistricting, this tradition is being carried forward.

The Sunday evening reception was held on the balcony of hotel with an open bar. The rain held off just long enough for everyone to gather and catch up. The humidity was sweltering, condensing on the skin just as fast as the drinks, but that did not damper the attendance. People were so eager to be out socializing with old colleagues after our long pandemic hiatus, the weather did little to deter.

Monday and Tuesday were filled with a variety of presentations. The opening session kicked off with ITE President Alyssa Rodriguez describing in detail what ITE at the international level is doing. She urged more professionals to volunteer on committees and highlighted the pro bono work volunteers have accomplished to date.

The Monday lunch keynote presented on the independent test track facility in Ohio, the Transportation Research Center. COTA provided a bus and driver for the Monday afternoon mobility tour. Jeff Kupko described to participants the Smart Columbus initiatives in action. The mobility tour ended at the Ohio DOT Traffic Management Center.

Monday evening's social was at Pins Mechanical Company. The bar featured duck bowling, a game played with smaller pins and a "bowling" ball to be thrown rather than rolled. The venue was complete with an open bar for conference attendees, free arcade games, and an adult-sized slide. It provided another opportunity for much needed networking.

Tuesday started at 8:30am with many technical presentations from which to choose. From how COVID impacted traffic to designing and planning for vision zero, the membership showed how their firms and agencies have been tackling challenges in the Great Lakes region. During all the sessions, eight vendors were available in the lobby to discuss products.

The meeting was only made possible thanks to the local arrangements committee and the 27 sponsors who supported the meeting through the uncertainty. This meeting was the first in-person district meeting for ITE post-pandemic.

The next district meeting will be held in Duluth, MN on June 20-22nd, 2022.

ITE Fall Technical Session Ocotber 6, 2021 in Kalamazoo, Michigan By: Matt Hill, WSP

The Fall Technical Session was Oct. 6, 2021 in Kalamazoo, MI with approximately 40 in attendance at the Kalamazoo Valley Groves Campus. This was our first in-person tech session since the pandemic started, so it was good to see everyone in person that attended. The morning kicked off with Hailey Savola and Jill Bauer of ROWE testing the traffic engineering knowledge of our attendees in an on-line trivia competition. Congratulations to Kyle Ramakers of Tetra Tech with the win!

Corey Hackworth of MDOT's Marshall TSC followed with a presentation on the I-69 Design-Build project in Calhoun and Eaton counties, which included some cool drone footage and some lessons learned regarding the DB process on one of MDOT's largest projects, public engagement, and how to preserve Massasauga rattlesnake habitat (spoiler alert, pay a fee to provide this habitat elsewhere).

Christina Anderson from the City of Kalamazoo then presented an update on the current and planned transportation improvements within the City with some historical context. Discussion largely focused on the various transportation studies that have been done over the years, the recent PEL conducted in the downtown, current roadway design guides the City is developing, as well as the relatively recent change in jurisdiction of several of the major one-way roadways that go through downtown from MDOT over to the City. Plans are for conversion of some of these roadways from one-way to two-way, and there was discussion on some of the non-motorized improvements that are being tested in the downtown currently and being planned for the near future.

Kelly Ferencz of HRC provided a career guidance session organized by the Young Transportation Professionals Committee. Kelly highlighted her career path and stressed many of the lessons learned along the way that have contributed to her success in this industry. One of the main takeaways was developing relationships within the industry. Relationships open doors and create opportunities for your career

to develop. Everyone in attendance also got to meet someone they previously did not know as part of a networking exercise led by Kelly.

Lunch was followed by the Michigan ITE awards announcements where the following award were handed out:

- Transportation Achievement Award to the City of Jackson and Hubbell, Roth & Clark for "Circling Greenwood"
- President's Award to Tim Haagsma, Kent County Road Commission
- Young Member of the Year Award to Ellen Nightingale, Michigan Department of Transportation

Pete Pfieffer, the MDOT Kalamazoo TSC Manager, followed the awards ceremony presenting on the high lake Michigan water concerns in Berrien County. The presentation focused on the lessons learned and problem solving techniques the department employed to alleviate roadway flooding that was occurring due to the rising Lake Michigan water levels as well as mitigating bluff erosion along the Lake itself. The problems were not always obvious and required multiple troubleshooting sessions to get to an effective solution. Pete walked us all through that process with some great photos and Q & A.

Our last speaker of the day was Ellen Nightingale of MDOT's SW Region who spoke on "Advocacy and Developing Younger Engineers." Ellen took us through the moments in her life that stood out where different people advocated for her and what led her to taking the steps to become an engineer (one of those steps involved her aiding in particle physics research at Notre Dame while still in high school on the urging of her science teacher). Ellen described different small and impactful efforts all professionals can do to meaningfully change lives, and provided examples of different types of networking (like ITE), mentoring, and making connections.






